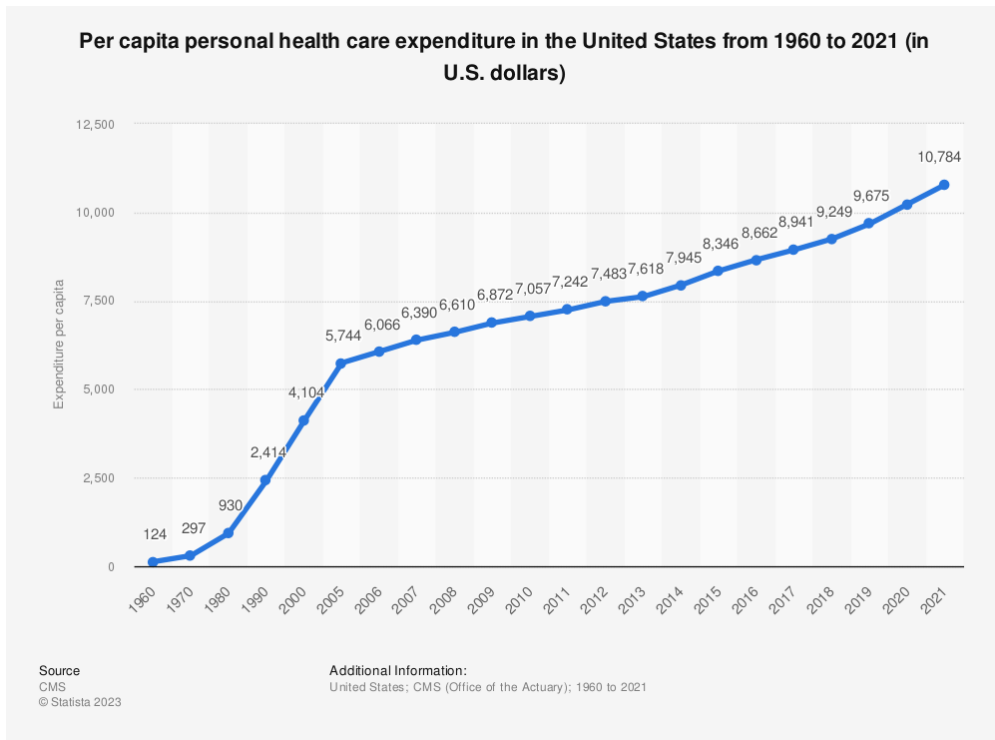
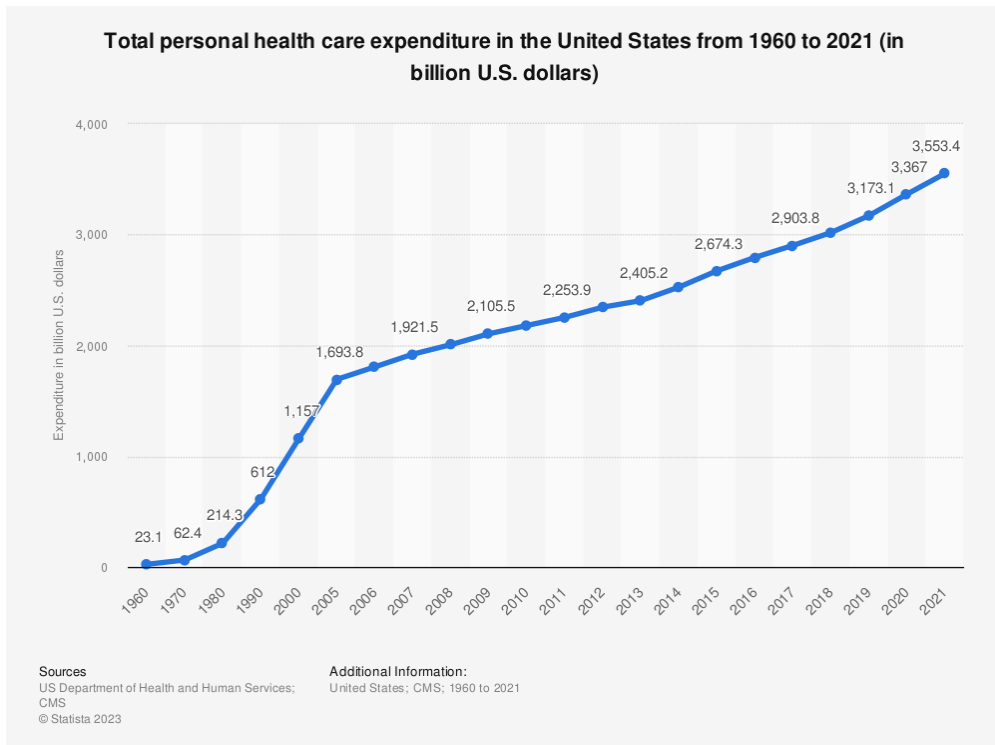
2. Physician and Clinical Services:

- From 2025-2031, it is expected to grow at an average rate of 5.7%.

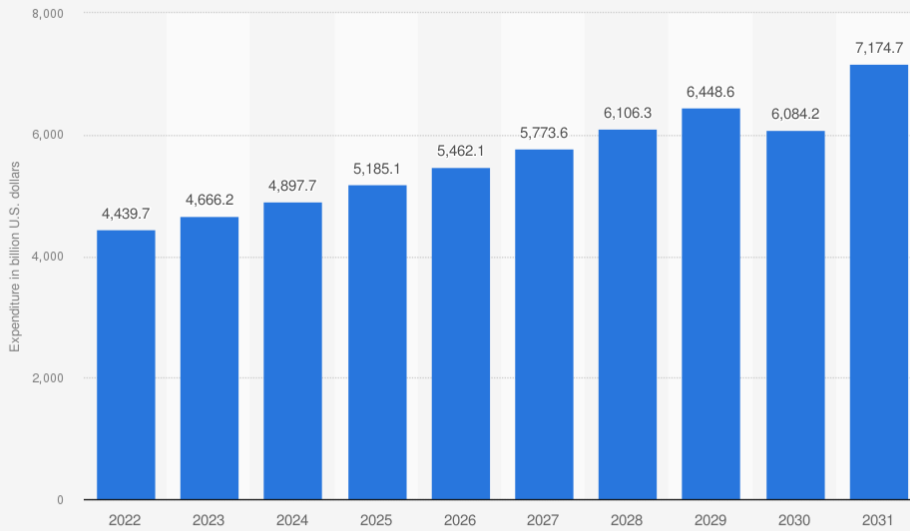
3. Retail Prescription Drugs:

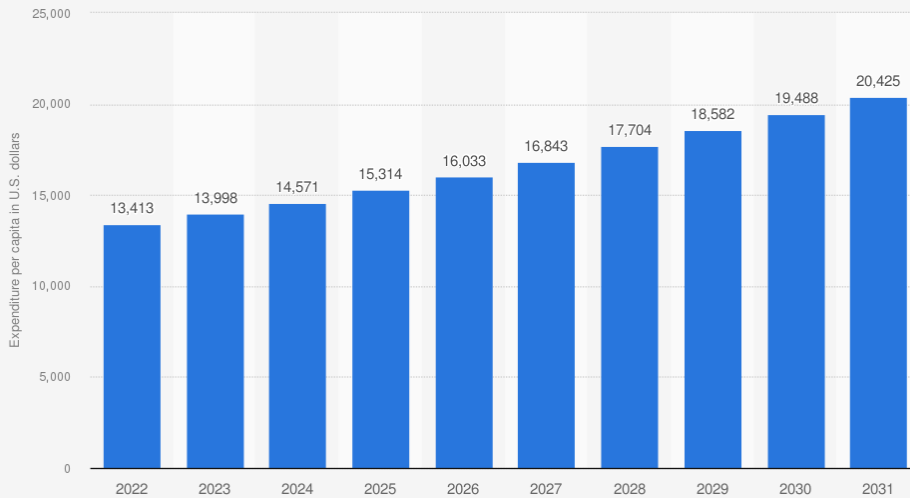
Forecasted U.S. national health expenditure from 2021 to 2031 (in billion U.S. dollars)

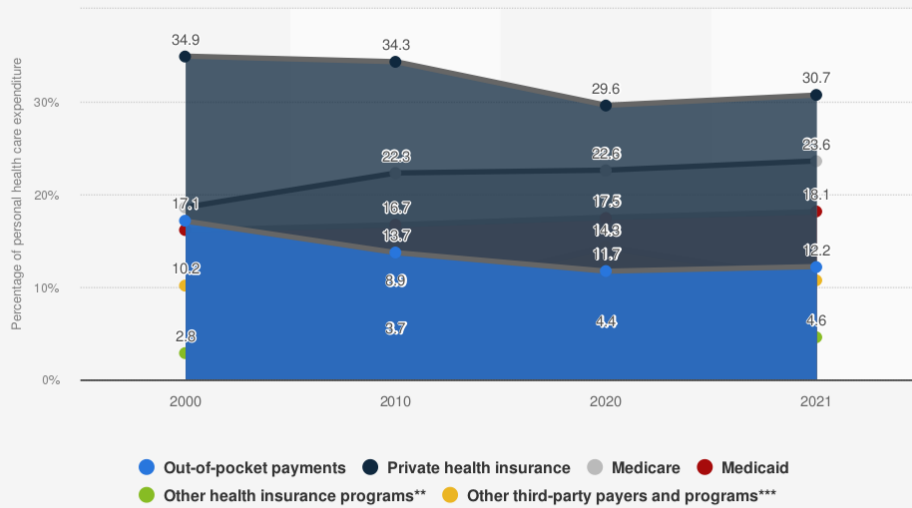
Forecasted national per capita health expenditure in the United States from 2021 to 2031 (in U.S. dollars)

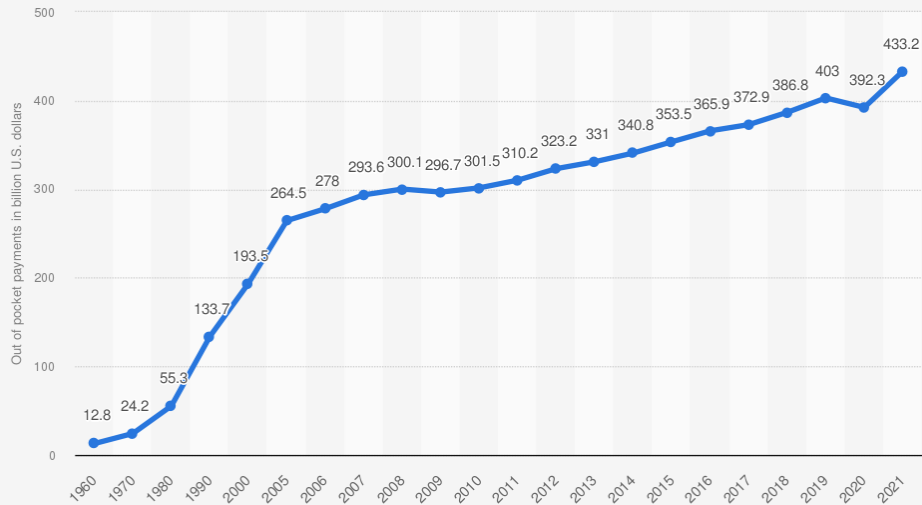
Distribution of total personal health care expenditure in the U.S. in 2000, 2010, 2020, and 2021 by source
